House Corporation: help in serving on one of our committees (Finances, Fundraising, Legal, Property Management & University Relations).












UNDERGRAD PROFILES

He has served as President of the United Way of South Suburbia and on the Board of Directors for the Crisis Center of South Suburbia. He served the chapter as a Pledge Trainer, Rush Chairman and Social Chairman. He also is a Past President of UK Alumni Association for Greater Chicago. As an undergraduate he served Kappa Sigma as Grand Procurator, Grand Master, and delegate to the 1959 Grand Conclave. He also was a member of Omicron Delta Kappa and Phi Tau Sigma Chemical Engineering Honorary, as well as Business Manager for the Kentucky Engineering Magazine, and he was a Student Government Association Representative from the College of Engineering.

As an alumnus he has served as Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Hilliard Lyons; President of the University of Kentucky Alumni Association; Chairman of the \$1 Billion campaign for the University of Kentucky; Vice Chairman for the University of Kentucky Board of Trustees; and Chair of the University of Kentucky Presidential Search Committee resulting in the hiring of President Eli Capilouto. Jim was involved in the founding of Kappa Sigma Chapters at Western Kentucky University and the University of Louisville. The James W. Stuckert Career Center at the University of Kentucky is named in his honor for the generous resources he and his wife, Diane, a former sweetheart of Beta-Nu Chapter and loyal member of Chi Omega. They have both been indicted into the University of Kentucky Fraternity and Sorority Hall of Fame.
