

## OUR 2019 MAN OF THE YEAR

## Jim Stuckert '56



The delayed 2019 Kappa Sigma Man of the Year banquet was held at the University of Kentucky on April 17th honoring Beta-Nu brother Jim Stuckert '56. As an undergraduate, Brother Stuckert served the Chapter as Grand Procurator and Grand Master. After graduating with a Bachelors of Science in Mechanical Engineering in 1960, Brother Stuckert returned to school and received an MBA a year later. During his professional career, Jim was responsible for equity trading at Hilliard Lyons prior to assuming the roles of Chairman and CEO in December of 1995.

Brother Stuckert has always valued his collegiate days and has found ways to volunteer his time to the University and to the Beta-Nu chapter. In 1976, Brother Stuckert was elected to serve as President of the University of Kentucky National Alumni Association and remains on the Board of Directors today. He also served as the Vice Chair of the Board of Trustees, and as Chair of the Finance Committee for five years. Brother Stuckert was inducted to the Alumni Hall of Fame at the University of Kentucky for his contributions in 1997.

As an Graduate Brother, Jim has remained active in Kappa Sigma by assisting in the founding of the Theta-Theta chapter at Western Kentucky University and the Mu-Eta chapter at the University of Louisville. For his dedication, Jim was awarded Kappa Sigma's A Greater Cause Distinguished Alumnus Award and was inducted into the University of Kentucky Fraternity and Sorority Hall of Fame. He credits the Fraternity with helping the development of his social, leadership and brotherhood skills. "I absolutely loved my pledge class, second semester of the 1955-1956 school year!" As for advice for undergraduates, Brother Stuckert stated: "Study Hard, work hard, have fun and learn to spend time wisely. Pay attention, be involved, and always be part of the solution-not the problem. Be a positive influence and appreciate what you have."
